- Eligibility:** The Regatta is open to any skipper or owner who wishes to participate. Participants must meet all Regatta requirements and go to <https://csnevents.org/JBTRegatta> to complete the registration form / waiver, create a fundraising page and make your minimum registration donation of \$50.
- Rules:** This Regatta will be governed by the 2021-2024 *Racing Rules of Sailing (RROS) Including US SAILING Prescriptions*, this NOR and the verbal sailing instructions communicated at the Skipper's Meeting (9:30 AM at WYC).
- Scoring:** The low point scoring system (Appendix A2) will be used. The Two Turn Penalty, Rule 44.2 of the RROS, shall be replaced with a One Turn Penalty.
- Entry:** Entry form & waiver must be signed and returned prior to the day of the event (a photocopy will be accepted).
